### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The BA (Hons) programme is designed to enable students to develop communication skills in the chosen language and to acquire a broad understanding of the society, history and culture within which these languages have developed and are used. Based on the conception of language as social and cultural practice, the programme integrates knowledge of social and political institutions, historical events and literary and cultural movements into the acquisition of the four linguistic skills - reading, comprehension, writing and speaking. The programme is thus designed to simultaneously develop language skills and critical thinking.

The process of language learning has been defined in accordance with the stages defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEF), which provides a basis for mutual recognition of language qualifications obtained in different learning contexts, thus facilitating educational and professional mobility. These stages are indicative of the desired level to be reached by the learner at the end of each year using parameters that are universally acceptable.

The BA (Hons) programme serves two purposes. It equips students who wish to continue their studies in a postgraduate programme in language, literary and cultural studies as well as those who choose to immediately enter professional life for a variety of employment opportunities (in translation, interpretation, tourism, foreign language teaching at the school and equivalent levels, publishing, the print and electronic media, and in other emerging areas in the corporate world where knowledge of a foreign language is either required or seen as an advantage).

# DISCIPLINE COURSES IN BA PROGRAMME - FRENCH | GERMAN | ITALIAN | SPANISH

#### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

French, German, Italian and Spanish are included as Discipline Courses in the BA programme of the University of Delhi. These Courses have the following objectives:

- 1. Acquisition of the four basic skills: written and oral comprehension; written and oral expression.
- 2. Promoting the study of society and culture of the countries where the language is spoken.
- 3. Introduction to the study of literature.
- 4. Initiation to the use of the foreign language for specific professional purposes.

The courses would thus equip students

- a. to continue studies in the foreign language at the postgraduate level.
- b. to enter professional life (in translation, tourism, the service industry or the corporate world) where knowledge of a foreign language is necessary or considered an advantage.
