

A CWSH CHALLENGE TO INDIAN YOUTH'S INNOVATIVE SPIRIT FOR SAFETY

PREAMBLE

The Centre for Workplace Safety and Health (CWSH) at NIE, Mysuru, is conducting this on-line competition to challenge young minds across the country to come up with safety-related ideas in any field. All active students in recognised Engineering Degree courses in India, in any sub-discipline are eligible. Intending participants are urged to read the attached brochure, and browse through our website: cewosh.com, and understand our vision and our mission, as this competition is aimed at increasing awareness and improving the management of workplace safety and health.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Submissions should be a maximum of TWO A4 size sheet pages, in doc, docx or pdf format, with 0.75-inch margins all around, in English text of 12-point Times New Roman font, single spaced, including any tables, illustrations etc. Entry may be less than two pages, but NOT more. Any entry which deviates from these requirements will be summarily rejected without explanation or intimation to the candidate.

As this competition is intended to bring out individual creativity rather than team effort, only one author per entry is permitted. All-text essays will be quite adequate. But novel products or processes relating to safety are also welcome. Current COVID safety will NOT be considered, with or without illustrations, but Post-COVID ideas for safety may be acceptable. The topic may be on any aspect of workplace safety and health in India, including travel to and from work, and work at or from home, with the following stipulations – please read and follow them carefully:

- It must highlight some aspect of everyday life in India, where some situation or action is obviously dangerous to workers and/or public, but most people have become so used to it that they are not even aware of the dangers or if aware, do not worry about them or about the consequences of continuing the same dangerous practice.
- The situation or action must not already have been declared a violation by authorities, with rules being flouted; an exception may be if author can propose a better and more practical solution than the one announced and violated.
- As far as the author knows or can determine, the problem and its solution must not already be public knowledge. (An evidence of this would be multiple entries of the same content, leading to rejection.) Any large-scale or verbatim copying from internet or other sources will be considered illegal plagiarism.
- The solution proposed must not involve highly sophisticated theories, costly equipment, or complicated processes, but must be amenable to reasonably simple and quick adoption by most organisations.
- The author should not stop with wishful thinking and philosophising, but must propose a fresh approach, a definite device or a practical procedure, to overcome the dangerous situation at hand, and improve the quality of life.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection will primarily be based on (a) Relevance to Indian conditions, (b) Originality of analysis and treatment, (c) Practicality of solution proposed, and (d) Style and strength of the description.

It is hoped that this challenge will provoke the younger generation to ponder over the ills that beset our current workplaces in regard to safety and health, and come up with ways and means which have the potential to promote public and management awareness of the problems and their solutions with local or regional resources and within a reasonable time frame. (Very sophisticated or expensive solutions may not be beneficial to our society!)

A jury of safety-related experts and members of the CWSH team will review the entries and select the prize winners. All or selected prize winners may be required to make short on-line presentations via zoom at the Anniversary event.

All prize-winning entries will become the joint property of CWSH and the author, with any further development actions, costs, and benefits of any product arising therefrom to be equitably shared between CWSH and the author.

PRIZES

First prize: Rs.10,000; Second prize: Rs.6,000; Third prize: Rs.4,000; Honourable Mention Awards: Rs.2,000. More than one prize of any category may be awarded, and any prize may not be awarded, at jury's discretion.




OUR MISSION
